EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Ahmednagar Jilha Maratha Vidya Prasarak Samaj, Ahmednagar established New Arts, Commerce and Science College, Parner, in 1977 with a view of imparting education and developing generations of students equipped with the knowledge. The institute has a tradition of producing outstanding students, who have rendered services in different walks of life. The present students have kept the track of excellence.

New Arts, Commerce and Science College, Parner has completed 45 years of its fruitful experience and has ambitious plans of development to excel in its services including academics, research and extension through innovations. The College is pleased to present a Perspective Plan for five years.

The plan is an outcome of the sincere discussions among the HoDs and IQAC of the College. The same has been approved by the CDC and the Governing body of the parent institute. New Arts, Commerce and Science College, Parner has been awarded the status of the **Best College by the University of Pune in 2014, NSS-Best College 2015, GoM- Road Safety Campaign 2016** for its excellence in academics and extension activities at university and state level. The activities of the college and faculties are recognized in terms of 25 awards at different levels. Academic activities undertaken by the college form the basis for its recognition in all strata of the society.

While preparing the present perspective plan, New Arts, Commerce and Science College, Parner has considered following main objectives:

- 1) Vision and Mission Statement of our College.
- 2) Quality Policy of the College.
- 3) Quality bench marking in higher education.

Objectives of Perspective Plan: Writing a vision document envisages a concerted team effort. Considering the background of our college as an institution imparting quality education, the College has identified the broad aim of perspective plan as follows:

- 1. To set a sustained quality system with a conscious, consistent and programmed action.
- 2. To create an academic environment with sincerity, discipline and commitment.
- 3. To shape human citizens of the nation.
- 4. To emerge as a model college for quality education.
- 5. To establish globally the brand image of the college.

The aim identified is to bring three 'H' together in an integrated manner viz., Hand (to develop skills), Head (to gain advanced knowledge) and Heart (to inculcate human values).

To achieve these aims, a set of following objectives are identified to be achieved through this perspective plan over the next 5 years:

- 1. To inculcate learner centric and effective teaching learning process.
- 2. To sustain good academic performance.
- 3. To ensure transparency and credibility in the process of evaluation.
- 4. To develop a comprehensive system of student mentoring and student support.



- 5. To achieve horizontal and vertical upgradation within the limits of time and expectations.
- 6. To strengthen a research culture in institute.
- 7. To initiate skills development programmes improving the employability of students.
- 8. To motivate students for self-employment and to enable them to emerge as entrepreneurs.
- 9. To set a friendly and efficient administrative set up ensuring a smooth functioning.
- 10. To empower faculty about emerging trend in their profession for academic advancement.

The proposed plan for academic development and sustainable growth:

1. Establishment of Research Centre:

The college started research centers in Botany and Chemistry in 2014 and proposes to start a research centre for Physics, Hindi, Economics and Geography. We have desire to give research exposure and training of methods and techniques in research to the students. These centers will function as coherent unit for the student development at a large scale.

2. Research Projects:

We plan to provide opportunities to faculty members to engage in research through research projects in all possible areas including interdisciplinary research. This will help them to enterprise and inculcate a scientific culture among the stakeholders. College desires to provide seed money to young researchers for building research recognition.

3. Research Publications and Patents:

College is promoting the researchers for quality outcomes in terms of research publications and patents. The researchers will be supported financially for publications research articles in UGC recognized reputed journals and patents.

4. Consultancy Services:

We plan to provide consultancy services for the dissemination of knowledge and expertise. The aim of our consultancy is to provide charged or voluntarily professional services such as knowledge, skills, expertise or advice.

5. Collaborations /Linkages with Foreign Universities:

The globalization has impacted extensively. The knowledge based economy can be strengthened on the basis of education also. The efforts of universalizing the education process are being made by establishing international linkages among different institutions. The skills and competence are considered as the prerequisites for manpower development. We aspire to be on the world map as an institute of quality and caliber, which may be brought in practice by establishing international linkages. We plan to establish linkages/collaborations between our college and foreign universities/Institutions in the field of education, research and training. Such collaborations will facilitate exchange of resources and expertise in various fields. With the help of collaboration, we can conduct research and training activities, seminars, conferences, and development programmes.

6. Vocational Education and Training:

We intend to initiate the new courses/programmes on entrepreneurship training among the students in the form of degree programmes. College has established MoUs in order to provide training and utilize expertise to train our students. An infrastructure facility for Skills training needs to be established. We have planned to submit a Detailed Project Report (DPR) to RUSA, GoM.



7. Strengthening of Accommodation Facilities:

The present accommodation facilities for the students are not sufficient to cater the needs of students. College has planned and obtained the grants from UGC for establishing one more hostel and the construction work is in progress. This facility will be made available to students at an earliest.

8. Renovation of Infrastructure:

The infrastructural facilities of the College are although adequate needs to be renovated to maintain cleanliness and ensure the learning ambience. We have planned to obtain the necessary funds form parent institute.

9. Language Laboratory:

The college plan to a start of state-of-art and an innovative language laboratory. Students will be benefitted from such a language laboratory to improve their language competency skills in Marathi, Hindi and English languages.

10. Coaching Centre for NET-JRF, SET, GATE:

The college aims to start a centre to guide the students to clear subject related competitive examinations successfully. This will make them competent and enable them to continue their higher studies like Ph.D.

11. Skills Oriented Short Term, Diploma and Advanced Diploma Courses:

We desire to offer short term certificate courses for students to enhance and imbibe various skills which will help them for employment. These courses will be taught to students through the services and expertise of experienced faculty and industry personals.

12. Innovation Ecosystem:

The institute has research centers in Botany and Chemistry. We intend to have more research centers through which research and innovative ideas can be gathered and could be turned into innovations through a thought process and systematic experimentation using resources. The training programmes can be conducted. This will help to inculcate the entrepreneurship development.

College will apply to MHRD, GoI for Innovation Center which will help to initiate the startup and incubation activities.

13. Environment and Green Audits:

The College has a plan to conduct a green and environmental audit of its natural resources. The audit will cover topics such as air quality, energy efficiency, water conservation, waste management, daily operations and maintenance. The audit can be conducted by hiring an agency.

14. E-learning Resources and Strengthening of ICT Facilities:

The college aims to provide better e-learning resources to the students. The online platforms such as NPTEL, courser can be used for online teaching-learning. The students will be supported through local chapters. ICT facilities will be strengthened in terms of ICT enabled classrooms, smart classrooms, virtual classroom and ICT tools for effective teaching learning process. College has a desire to use flipped classroom mode for fruitful outcomes of TLP. These will be used for curriculum delivery and evaluation mechanisms.



15. Strengthening of Library, E-books and Digital Libraries:

The college library will require more space to maintain the upkeep facilities in terms of increased number of learning resources. We propose to introduce E- Library facility which will cover a large number of e-books and e-journals for the purpose of reference. Through this facility the students will be able to access various books and other reading materials remotely via computer networks. INFLIBNET and NLIST services will be utilized. College planned to participate in National Mission on Education through ICT (NME-ICT) by e-content development.

16. Faculty Training and Development:

The training and development of faculty has been one of the important objectives of our college. Besides participation of teachers in Orientation Courses, Induction Programmes and Refresher Courses, specialized areas of interest need to be undertaken for training. The use of audio visual aids, development of effective communication skills, software development, institutional image building and public relations etc. are some of the areas.

17. Peer Reviewed Journal of College:

We desire to initiate a peer reviewed journal, which will include the research expertise of the faculties and trained personnel from different fields for the benefit of all. The editorial board may be comprised of alumni and expert form college as well as other institutes of repute.

18. Academic Audit and Annual Quality Assurance Reports (AQAR):

Academic audit is an important apparatus to review the processes or procedures that faculty members use to provide a quality education in their department and to understand the effective measures that departments employed in successful conduct of the activities. An academic audit will focus on strategies that a department uses to ensure quality education, and not their actual teaching. It will also analyze how it can improve students' learning. The outcomes will be documented in terms of AQAR and submitted to NAAC in scheduled time.

19. Solar Energy Harvesting:

The college aims to encourage and create environment awareness among the students. To attain this goal, we intend to initiate a Solar Energy Harvesting program with the assistance of experts in the field.

20. Rain Water Harvesting:

Parner tehsil belongs to the hilly and drought prone area of Ahmednagar district and has limited rain fall. In order to meet the needs of water necessary for smooth functioning of college as well as for watering plants, we are harvesting the rain water regularly. College has desire to increase the sources water by harvesting more rain water which is flowing from the new hostel buildings as well recycling the processed waste water.

21. Strengthening of Soil and Water checking center:

We have initiated the activities for testing of water and soil samples on nearby citizens and farmers for their parameters with the help of students as public health services. The college has planned to strengthen it in the form of advanced instrumental facilities as well as an authorized center of GoM.

22. To adopt a village for overall development:

Adoption of a Village is a unique sustainable development model based on community development. The main aspects considered are Education, Clean Water, Sanitation



Health, Livelihood, Agriculture and Food Security. College has planned to adopt a nearby village and conduct various activities including Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) for its development with the NSS, NCC, etc.

23. To strengthen Competitive Exam Centre for Students:

The college aims to strengthen a Competitive Examination Centre with the objective of providing academic facilities to the students of Maharashtra aspiring for administrative career by successfully appearing for the Civil Services Examinations. The long-term goal is to create awareness and interest among students about Civil Services and motivate the youth from Maharashtra to achieve the services.

24. Career Guidance and Placement Cell:

College has put the sincere efforts in providing career guidance to the students with the aid of guidance talks of faculties, industry personals, renowned experts, entrepreneurs. College also provided the opportunities for placements in industries with the help of on or off campus placement drives. We have planned to strengthen the cell with a separate placement officer who will be able to enhance the linkages and placements.

25. Digitalization of the College Campus:

HEI believes in modern technology for smooth and effective functioning of different sections of the college. Modern Technology will help for efficient connectivity, quickness and perfection in the working of the college. It will ensure the accuracy in preparation of documents, reports and retrieval of the documents.

26. Documentation and Record keeping:

The records about distinguished alumni, teachers, guests of honour, administrative developments, examinations records, etc. will be the main components to be preserved for future references. It will require digitalizing the records with microfilming and CDs.

27. Development of the college website:

Website of institute is a tool used for continuous communication with the stakeholders and a facility to publicize the projects, schemes and activities of the college. The website of college needs to be updated and upgraded continuously.

28. Strengthening Sports Complex:

The college plans to establish a sports complex equipped with all modern facilities. We have desire to have a multipurpose auditorium for indoor games.

29. Online Feedback System:

The college plans to practice an online feedback on curriculum, facilities, teaching learning and research and extension activities and services from stakeholders.

30. Autonomous Status:

The challenge of competition at the global level, enhancing employability among students and sustaining quality efforts are the main forces behind becoming autonomous. We propose to apply for autonomy in response to the appeal made by the UGC, SPPU, Pune and the State Government. Before that, we need to apply for College with Potential for Excellence.

1. Faculty Development
